	Ellyn Clost-Lambert reported that we are not able to use data from the student census due to privacy agreements. It will be important to be able to follow up with students if concerns arise from their responses to this survey, so it will be confidential but not anonymous. Considerations have been given to accessibility, consent, wording of the questions, etc.

	 The phone version was good, consent looks quite long but it needs to be, the survey was short. The survey was indeed short. The length is a selling point. Suche James advised that it would be nice to know students' race, gender, and sexual orientation. It is important to keep the same language as in the census for consistency. Shawn Quiqley inquired about including programs such as SNAP and LINKS for students who are not attending mainstream school For international students or students where English is their second language, does the survey consider accessibility? Like the list of services at the end. Can there be a "back" button? What about a progress bar? Can there be an audio or video component can be integrated to the consent form? Closed captioning?

6. Student Mental Health Supports During January 2021 Remote Learning Period	SSCs, ACWs, SWs provided virtual supports to K-12 students, either through telephone or MS Teams. Virtual support resources were developed for SSCs and ACWs. An updated LDSB pathways to care and community resource list were created. There were two crisis calls during the January 2021 remote learning period. These students were supported by our community partners.	L. Conboy

8. Supporting Transition Resilience of Newcomer Groups (STRONG)	1 FTE SSC to support students receiving school to community programming These positions are supported through one-time COVID finding and will end June 25, 2021. STRONG was developed in partnership with SMHO and The Center for School Mental Health in Maryland. The 10-week group is designed to promote resilience and reduce distress among newcomers. 	Conboy attended the two day virtual training. Next steps before running a group: Attend a booster session February 2, 2021; better understand LDSB's newcomer populations; explore a collaboration with Immigrant Services Kingston and Area.	
9. The Umbrella Project	LDSB has been able to offer 5 schools with this whole school, curriculum-based program for free, thanks to a grant from a community partner. An electronic dashboard, which includes K-12 lesson plans are provided to staff which focus on three pillars: • Positive Priming • Inquiry Based Learning • Role Modelling The five schools participating are: Bayridge PS, Henderson PS, Polson Park PS, Rideau PS, Virtual Elementary School. 10. Online Student Self-Referral Link	The self-referral links for students to request school-based mental health supports are now live on all secondary school websites. This is an opportunity for secondary students to have equitable access to mental health services. Students are able to request ACW or SW services via this link. Inter-school council has been providing feedback to guide the implementation from the students' perspective to improve the students' experience. Social Media promotion will occur when the logistics have been worked out. Suche James wondered if there was an option to have the form in multiple languages (i.e., Arabic, Somali).	L. Conboy
