### 4. <u>Community Organization Update</u>

### Student Representatives

S. Laing reported on the following items:

- Interschool Council had a battery battle between secondary schools. The recycled batteries will be donated so that the zinc can be extracted and donated to countries with a zinc deficiency
- The Eco-Club participated in Pitch In Kingston by cleaning La Fleur Park
- LCVI plans to run another clean-up event
- LCVI carnival will include vegan treats and garden plants for students to take home
- LCVI is in process of acquiring compost bins for the school
- Eco-Club is trying to eliminate straws at the school

### <u>KCAT</u>

R. Healy reported that the City of Kingston Active Transportation Master plan is now live. It includes structural plans for connections for the major east-west and north-south thoroughfares. The plan also identifies neighbourhood landmarks (high schools, shopping, etc) with a focus on determining how people get to them. The City is aiming for 20% of all trips to be by active travel and aiming to raise the transit use from 9% to 15%.

### Parent Involvement Committee

R. Hutcheon stated that PIC met on May 10 and formed a working group to address use of technology in classrooms.

It was reported that parents from different schools have expressed dissatisfaction with the Evergreen partnership. From a sustainability standpoint some parents don't think the Board should have contracted a third-party organization.

Manager Fowler stated that the intent of Evergreen is to be a consultant, not the leader of a schoolyard naturalization project. He stated that he would be happy to speak with any parents or school administration about the issue.

### St. Lawrence College

B. Gilmour reported on the following program/initiatives at St. Lawrence College:

- Green Circle Salon salons can subscribe and recycle cut hair and product containers. The program makes booms out of the hair for oil spills, etc.
- June 4th Breakfast for the Commuter Challenge
- The college will be an official 'drop bike site' through the City of Kingston.

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- Currently working on the college's Sustainability Plan
- E-waste drop-off event collected 2.9 metric tonnes of e-waste.
- Participating in Pitch-In Kingston
